In the past SPOT has had **collections of items to create care bags** for parishioners to carry in their cars to give to people they see who are homeless, hungry, or otherwise in need. The commission has decided to make this an ongoing project. Therefore, there will be **two collection baskets, one in the Narthex and one in the parish hall** where you can place donated items. Going forward we will make bags as we have enough supplies. Suggestions include \$5 gift cards to Dunkin or McDonalds (put on Diane's desk, not in basket), travel or sample size toiletries, sun block, bug spray, individual packets of wet wipes or baby wipes, chap stick, beef jerky, granola or breakfast bars, tuna salad kits, peanut butter or cheese crackers, apple sauce or pudding cups, small water bottles, pens, and note pads. Thank you for your generosity!

While you are grocery shopping and perhaps thinking about **food for the hungry, don't forget the food box located in the Narthex**. Ingrid Menon takes the items to the South Windsor Food Bank on a regular basis. Some suggestions from the food bank include canned pasta, cans of chunk chicken/tuna, paper towels/toilet paper, cans of fruit, pasta sauce, granola bars and crackers, fresh produce (take directly to community center, DO NOT PUT IN BOX), cereal, peanut butter and jelly, personal hygiene products (soap, shampoo, toothpaste, feminine care products, etc...), and cleaning products. Since this list overlaps the list for the little pantry you can put some of them in either place.

We have a new system for keeping the little pantry stocked. There is a sign-up sheet on the short hall bulletin board where you can sign up to tend to the pantry for a week at a time. It involves bringing items from the counting room out to the pantry twice during your assigned week.

The Little Pantry in front of the Church is used often and, therefore, frequently empty. Please help by putting items directly in the pantry. Thank you. This week's suggestions: pudding cups, cooking oil, and condiments.
